

# mod podge instructions

1. Lightly sand the edges of your board and wipe with a lint free cloth or paper towel.
2. Apply paint evenly to top and sides of board. It is only necessary to paint the area on the top that will not be covered by the photo.
3. Allow paint to dry. Once dry, you can sand the edges to make it more rustic if desired.
4. Apply an even layer of mod podge to the board Immediately place your photo down and work all air bubbles to the edges. You may need to look at it at eye level to see all of them.
5. Once your photo is positioned and free of bubbles, apply another even coating of mod podge to the top and sides. I prefer to use a 4 inch microfiber roller for this... however a sponge brush, or regular paint brush may be used. If you use a roller, you will need to use a paint brush on the exposed painted edges to smooth out the mod podge. Otherwise, the edges will dry with a milky appearance.
6. This last coating will take about a half hour to dry before it should be transported. Be careful not to touch the photo for a few days as you can still leave finger prints in the finish.
7. Do not place anything on top of the photo... EVER Mod Podge is a type of glue and things will stick to it. Store the photo in a plastic bag or wrap in clear cellophane wrap.
8. Display in a number of ways. Apply hanging hardware, hang with a tied ribbon, or set on an easle.

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
